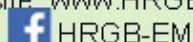

## MESSAGE FROM THE OUTGOING CHAIR.



When I took on the role of Region Chair in 2017, I said at the time that I would hold the post until my wife retired. She retired in April 2022, but due to the proposal to close the Region at that year's AGM I agreed to stay on for another year. That year has now passed and I have decided to hand over the reins to someone new. I have enjoyed most of my time as Chair of the HRGB Region with by far the lowest number of members, but there were times that were challenging – not least for the two years of lockdowns. (There are several words in the English language that I would prefer not to hear again – Lockdown, Pandemic, 2 metre separation, Hands, Face, and Space, among others)



The Region committee continued to meet on Zoom and we managed to arrange some virtual rallies also on Zoom. The attendance at those computerised rallies from the Region was rather disappointing, but the visits from our handbell ringing friends from around the world and other Regions made it worthwhile. I know that some groups managed to meet in person occasionally – perhaps in someone's back garden or in the garage with the doors wide open, but I think that most groups were forced into a temporary cessation of ringing activities. Although the Coronavirus is still lurking around, hopefully that dark period is now well and truly behind us and we can continue with our musical hobby. My own group, The Stanwick Handbell Ringers met on Zoom every Monday evening throughout the lockdowns and that experience was very



beneficial in maintaining a level of interest in handbells.

A happier event that took place in my time as Chair was the celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of HRGB at Barnsdale Hall close to the shore of Rutland Water. Several Region Members enjoyed a lunch followed by a performance given by the Beverley Town Handbell Ringers. More recently it gave me great pleasure to award two members, Jane Heald and Brian Buttery with Honorary Region Member certificates in recognition of their long service to the Region and HRGB generally.



It has often been challenging to find venues and hosts for rallies and because of the geographical size of the Region it has meant that a significant distance must be travelled by many members to attend events. As fuel and other costs continue to increase it is likely to mean that even less ringers will be able to attend rallies, so it would be great if teams from around the Region would offer to host a rally so that teams in all parts of the Region could take part in their own area and travelling distance could be reduced. Please do think about whether your team could get involved. The Region Committee could do most of the work involved with the organisation of a rally. They just need to be made aware of a suitable venue.

I do understand and accept that some groups do not wish to take part in any rallies for a variety of reasons, but if you have never been to a rally, please give it some thought and have a go. You might enjoy meeting up with Ringers from other groups and perhaps learn from them – or – they might learn from you – Now there's a thought!!

In closing for this last time, I would like to thank all the Officers, Committee and all Region members – past and present and future for their ongoing invaluable support for the Region. Without their dedication there would be no Region.

I hope to see you at an East Midlands Region event in the not-too-distant future.

At the start of the morning, we had a flying visit from a feathered friend who obviously decided that handbells were not his scene and flew out of the nearest window.
