

We had Tim Waugh, Susan Nelson, Michael Glasgow and Larry and Carla Sue from America, Damien Lim from Singapore and Kevin Ko from Hong Kong. We were treated to brilliant video clips of some of their work. When you consider the time differences between those countries, it was amazing that we

could all get together for such an event. Many people that attended those events sent in their compliments and said that they looked forward to the next one. Watch this space – there may well be another virtual rally in the spring of 2022.

As I'm sure you know, we have not been able to organise a "Face to Face" handbell ringing event since the start of the Covid pandemic (March 2019 – as if you need reminding?) but really hope to organise a "Get back to ringing" event early in 2022. This will be free to attend for HRGB members so please do try to be there. (There will be a small charge for non HRGB members, who will also be welcome) It would be really good to see people perhaps new to events such as this, along with the regular faces. You will be able to come with members of your team or on your own – there is always a space for individual ringers to join in with the massed ringing that is normally part of a rally. Some teams have duplicate bells that can be used by individual attendees and

some teams actually need help on the day to ring their team pieces.

We are hopeful that we will be able to hold some "ordinary" rallies in the coming year (hopefully 2 in addition to the "Get back to Ringing event" mentioned above) and as always we are on the lookout for volunteer teams to host one. If you know of a suitable venue — village/community hall or School



hall for instance that could be used, please let any Region committee member have details so that we can follow it up. In theory that is all you need to do! The committee would make all the other arrangements. However, if you are able or want to be a bit more involved, acting as a point of contact between the committee and the proposed venue, maybe providing some refreshments and/or lunch would be very much appreciated.

I am sorry that some teams have lost members during the last couple of years due to the pandemic or for other reasons and I hope that when things get back to whatever normality is in the coming months, you will be able to get new members. None of us are getting any younger and we really must try to encourage the younger generation to be involved with practical music making. I know that many (most?) young people have oodles of other things to occupy themselves nowadays, but maybe you know one or two that would enjoy the uniqueness and diversity of making a noise



(music?) with those metallic percussion instruments. This region has gained two new junior teams during the last few months and I would congratulate and thank Judy Gees and Nicola Wright for their work in setting up those teams. Hopefully we will see some of their members at our future events.

As I've said before, the HRGB National Membership database is up and running and it is important that members have their details entered correctly, including—most importantly—a valid email address. This is so that any communications that are sent out from either HRGB or the Region can be disseminated by email using the mass emailing system, rather than the sender having to enter email addresses individually or sending the communication by post. I do appreciate that some people are reluctant to have their details lodged on computer systems but the HRGB system has been tried and tested and it is as secure as it can be. Use of this system makes huge reduction in the workload for the Membership Secretary and others when wanting to pass on information of events etc. Out of interest.

HRGB continue to organise national seminars (or webinars as some people call them). 

Observations of Virtual Rally by Judy Goes

We have just had our second virtual rally hosted by Mike Johnson and the East Midlands Region. Two quizzes, lots of videos, and some wonderful massed ringing on kids' bells, spoons and of course real bells and chimes, where available.

We had a very powerful emotional moment when Damien played



international collaboration, Peace on Earth. This was played on bells and chimes by thirty three ringers from around the world.

There was not a dry eye.

Earlier this year, in July, I was contacted by the secretary of the Wellingborough Singers, a well-known choir in

Northamptonshire, asking if the Stanwick Handbell Ringers would be able to help with their concert planned to take place on the 14th November – Remembrance Sunday. We would be required to ring the bells towards the end of a composition by Dan Forrest (an American Composer) with the title "In Paradisum", As a group, we had done this on two previous occasions – with the Northampton Bach Choir in 2012 and the Huntingdonshire Philhamonic in 2018. This new invitation would mean that the performance would be our first outing since March 2019 and would be a fairly high profile occasion as more than 200 audience members (paying £10 each for tickets) were anticipated for the Remembrance Sunday concert.

The group agreed that we would like to do it, subject to any new restrictions being imposed due to Covid 19 in the meantime although the pandemic was still very much in existence, most of the formal restrictions had been lifted by that time.

We already had the sheet music for the piece, so we were able to get going on it fairly quickly, but we needed some extra bells to be able to ring the octave above as suggested as an option by the composer. Thank you to Grantham Town HR for allowing us to borrow the additional bells.

As the weeks passed, we were provided with more information regarding timings and details of how and where we were to do our bit, with a final agreement that we would initially ring at the back of the Church behind the audience and at a given point we would then process along the aisle and round the choir and

orchestra and disappear into the vestry behind the audience while still randomly ringing the bells – using the composers words "gradually fading away in the distance"

Finally, the day arrived and we donned our uniforms and poppies and set up our ringing position in the Church ready for a short rehearsal. I think at this point the Choir's Musical Director was more confident than we were that we would do a good job.



The choir is led by Lee Dunleavy, a noted composer, choir master and Musical Director who works with 4 choirs in our area and his works have been performed in almost all of the major cathedrals and churches in England. His a-cappella arrangement of the National Anthem was commissioned by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, and first performed there in the presence of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

"Our" concert was an hour long with the first piece "Requiem for the Living" another composition by Dan Forrest of 45 minutes duration. This was a very powerful piece comprising five movements of varying dynamics, with a 10 piece orchestra and the Church organ providing the supporting music. Our piece, of about 15 minutes duration was the second and final piece on the programme, in which we were only required to ring in the final 10 bars of the 190 bar total, with the extra random ringing as we processed through the Church. After reaching the vestry, we about faced and went back to stand in front of the choir and were met with what felt like a solid wall of applause.

As we were packing up our equipment, several audience

members commented that we sounded magical (?) and that we added a very atmospheric finale to the moving piece of music.

We were pleased with what we had done and are now looking forward to getting back to some of our more normal performances in the new year.

own region, but with members joining from other regions and, once again, overseas.



Notes of the NEC meeting held on Saturday 3rd July 21

2. Chair's opening remarks. The chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. He said the intention is to have a shorter meeting than usual!

3. Minutes of last meeting.

With amendments, the minutes were agreed and accepted.

4. Matters Arising

Item 9 Regional Representatives roles— Some Regional Reps are not aware that they are trustees of HRGB. The elected officers have agreed that a specific brief induction is needed for new trustees. This could be done at a meeting on Zoom.

SW region said that they are having trouble getting regional reps and it is likely that informing them that they will be trustees of HRGB will make this task more difficult

5. Starting to Ring Again

A regional roundup was reported by NEC members:

EM – going forward, committee meetings will continue on Zoom. 2 teams using Zoom regularly. Held regional rally on 6th June which included international attendees. Virtual rally planned for 17th July. Continue to publish a full colour newsletter.

Members were asked to feedback the appreciation of the whole NEC for everything that individuals, teams and committees are doing to keep handbell ringing going. A great deal of creativity is evident in the ways that members have responded constructively to the restrictions imposed by the pandemic.

Future EventsRegional Events

2022 National Rally - Sheffield Information will be in the Autumn edition of Reverberations.

2023 National Rally, Stirling – encouraged by number of volunteers offering help.

2024 National Rally, Kettering – date has been confirmed with the venue.

ii. Virtual Events

Three events have been held since the last NEC: 17th April Aidan Fozard on Techniques with 90 attendees.

15th May Malcolm Wilson on Capturing Young People's Imagination with 60 attendees.

19th June Virtual Massed Ringing with 120 attendees.

Members are invited to both make suggestions for possible future sessions and offers to lead a presentation would be welcome. One suggestion was a discussion forum on how to select music which will interest experienced ringers when your team has reduced in size.

iii. International Events

20th International Symposium, Nashville, USA - Massed Ringing Music - the judges had selected Robin Benton's Celebration for Bells.

22nd International Symposium, 2026 UK – the sub-committee has identified 5 preferred venues – Newcastle Gateshead Quays, ICC Wales, EXCEL London, Manchester Central and SECC Glasgow. Negotiations are in progress

Money Matters

Review & Approval of 2020 Accounts - previously circulated. The accounts were accepted by the meeting.

Any region with concerns about their finances were encouraged to get in touch with Anthony.

Review of 2021 to date - The current financial position of HRGB is quite strong, but there may still be an impact as the COVID-19 pandemic continues

Anthony was thanked for all his work on our finances.

8. Membership

Membership has increased by 195 since our last meeting. There are 3 new teams - 2 of which are youth teams in EM region. Membership Secretary has been looking at producing a protocol for death notifications and made some suggestions to this meeting.

9. Membership Renewals Software

A test version of the online renewal facility has been received and tested. For the most part it is acceptable and easy to use. Indications are that the new facility will be usable for 2021/2 renewals.

10. Social Media

Thanks were expressed to Malcolm Wilson and Amanda Jones for keeping our social media channels full.

11. Archives

Alan has obtained agreement from the Trustees of Norbury HR, to produce a commercial CD from the tapes that are in the Archive made of the team in 1975. Once Covid restrictions relax, he will get back in touch with Huddersfield University archives. English Brass Bands have put their archives there.

'Amanda Jones has transferred 30 videos to DVD for the archives. She is now looking for someone to transfer from DVD to digital so the footage is preserved for posterity and editable should we wish to use

them.

Minster Minis (New EM region junior team) have a set of bells on loan. Otherwise there is little activity.

13. Reverberations

Back copies have been scanned up to 1986.

14. Sales

Things are very quiet. Receiving about one order per week.

15, Website

The website has been used successfully to book the various webinars being run and this is encouraging members to visit the website, often for the first time. It was pointed out that some browsers eg Firefox do not support the HRGB website. Some issues identified with the security certificate – now reissued. It is best to use www. handbells.org.uk

16. Handbells in Education

There had been no recent activity.

17. Policy on conditions for attending Ringing Events

Tim presented a paper outlining possible ways forward. It was agreed that our current Covid sub-committee of Keith Meader, Laura Buist, Gay Cooper and Mike Johnson - would give some thought to a policy once the governments' guidelines are announced. In the meantime, our current interimpolicy remains in place.

18. Matters arising from the AGM

There were none.

19. Gender Equality

EM Region committee tabled a proposal that the HRGB rules be revised to remove all gender specific references in advance of any other rule changes that may or may not be approved in the future. This was agreed.

It is hoped that an AGM will be sufficient to make these changes rather than a referral to the Charities Commission.

20. New National Officers

Members were asked for names of individuals who could take on these roles.

21. Safeguarding

Tim has contacted Michelle Robbins, a safeguarding trainer, who is happy to train relevant people.

EM Region proposed that standard approved forms to be added to the HRGB website safeguarding pages for use by regions and individual teams as required. It was agreed that this would be the form developed by the NE Region. Christine Lazenby offered to ask Andrew Ford to add the HRGB logo to the form in place of the NE Region logo...

22. Charity Governance Code

The next section of the Code we need to reflect on deals with Board Effectiveness and will be for discussion at the September meeting.

23. Charity Commission News

Nothing to report.

24. A.O.B.



Notes from the HRGB NEC Meeting Saturday 2nd October 2021. Held on Zoom.

The following are précised notes of the meeting. If a member wishes to see the full version please contact the editor.

Chair's Welcome:

Tim Willetts (Chair) welcomed all to the meeting and was informed that there were three apologies for absence. All members were thanked for their efforts and input to maintain HRGB and handbell ringing during the pandemic.

Minutes of the Last Meeting:

The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Zoom licence fees for the forthcoming year. It was agreed that HRGB would issue a 50% refund of the licence fee for this year.

Region Reports:

EM region stated that the Region committee continue to meet on Zoom. The "Get Back to Ringing" event has been deferred until the new year when, it is hoped, more ringers might be encouraged to attend. The Region team have recently started rehearsal sessions again. The third virtual rally will be held (on zoom) on 17th October. All welcome – it is hoped that there will again be some international attendees.

Other Regions also reported

Future Events:

National Rally 2022. The paperwork for the event is being resurrected and checked/amended as necessary with 2 teams working on the arrangements. Some new bookings have been received as a result of the article in Reverberations.

A very long discussion followed regarding the ongoing implications of the Covid pandemic and how they might impact on the feasibility of the event.

Webinars: The original suggestion for November will now be held on 4th December and the subject will be Musical Phrasing and the January 2022 date has been moved to February and the subject will be Massed ringing.

International Symposia: No further information was presented for the 20th Symposium in Nashville (August 22) A brief update was given for the 22nd Symposium to be hosted in UK Glasgow is the preferred venue at this stage,

Strategic Matters:

Ringing Again Despite Covid: There was an extended discussion regarding the

submitted guidelines for organisers of events while the pandemic is still prevalent. Many of the comments suggested that the proposed guidelines were overly restrictive in view of the current advice/guidance being provided by the Government. It was eventually agreed that a policy statement is required, with the final wording to be agreed before appearing on the HRGB Website. It was subsequently agreed that the 2022 National Rally organisation could proceed under that agreement.

Refunds: A proposal was tabled by SE region suggesting that if a member was unable to attend a previously booked event and was not able to attend due to testing positive for covid and/or displaying the symptoms, then to organisers of the event should look kindly on a request for a refund of fees paid. This was agreed.

Business Matters:

Gender Neutral Rules: It was agreed at the previous meeting that the Chair of EM region would look at amending the standing HRGB rules with the remit to remove all gender specific references. The revised draft rules were tabled and with one slight amendment were accepted for tabling at the next HRGB AGM. **Consent Forms:** The forms for Parent/guardian consent (as previously discussed) are now available on the HRGB Website.

Managing the work of the New National Officers:

How Their Work might be managed: The Chair requested that this item be deferred until the next meeting,
